Additionally, coils of jet-black hair elegantly fall down the forehead, enhancing its overall artistry. Measuring at a substantial 12 inches in width and 22 inches in height, this mask embodies the rich artistic heritage of Latin America and stands as a testament to the skill and creativity of its maker.
